RESEARCH PROJECTS

Green Harbors Project (GHP) (2008) www.umb.edu/gbh: Dr. Frankic initiated and developed GHP with the vision and mission to provide undergraduate and graduate students opportunity to work in the local environment by developing their individual projects, thesis and dissertation topics that will integrate educational, research and outreach components and support sustainability in Urban Harbors. GHP's premise is "The environment sets the limits for sustainable development and coastal stewardship. We can adapt with the rest of nature and flourish environmentally, economically and culturally." GHP, part of the Center for Governance and Sustainability, has been selected as one of the global coastal solutions by Savannah Ocean Exchange, and represents a pilot case study for UNEP/GUPES (United Nations Environment Program/Global University Partnership on Environment for Sustainability). GHP developed guidelines for the first "Green Harbors" in the USA and establishing a green harbor network globally. EPA Region 1 selected Dr. Frankic and her team at UMB to lead urban watershed restoration in Boston area, and they recently signed the MOU.

Oyster population Propagation and Conservation Project, Wellfleet Harbor (2010): GHP is collaborating with the Town of Wellfleet in an Oyster propagation project for the Harbor. The project uses a novel and holistic approach to improve conditions caused by excess nutrients and coastal eutrophication and to meet state-wide nutrient loading goals. For example, an adult oyster may filter 25-50 gallons of water providing nutrient and carbon sinks. This project involves establishing an approximately two acre oyster spawning and settlement ground that is expected to provide the following benefits: approximately 2 million additional oysters annually; potential increase in commercial shellfish value of \$1million; and 50-90 million gallons of increased water filtration daily.

Croatian Nature Protection Investment Project (CNPIP) (2008): Dr. Frankic spearheaded this project as a follow up to the karst ecosystem conservation project in Croatia; she helped develop proposal for the largest conservation project in the Adriatic region; in the summer of 2008 the project preparation phase was launched when Dr. Frankic worked as a consultant for the World Bank.

EUROPEAN CONSENSUS Project (2005/06): Dr. Frankic was invited by the European Aquaculture Society to advise and to help prepare the New Strategy for Sustainable Aquaculture Development in Europe; she was the only invited member of the working group invited outside the EU member states; Dr Frankic was a leader and moderator of the Shellfish working group of fifteen stakeholder representatives including scientists, practitionaries, sea food industries, marketing, policy and regulation; The final report with recommendations is included in the preparation of the EU Marine Directive.
