Directions: Take the two coins and toss them into two of the three boxes next to each body part for your sea creature on Side Two. Circle whatever characteristic they land on in each of the eight boxes, so that when you go into Microsoft Paint, you can begin to draw your sea creature in its habitat using the characteristics you circled on each of the two charts. Have fun and be creative!!!!!! As you create, start thinking of ways to use the eight parts of speech to construct a well written, descriptive and fun essay about your creature.

For Homework-Construct a 450-600 word rough draft essay on your sea creature and its habitat that you circled, being creative and using critical thinking skills. Using Microsoft Word's highlighting ability, make sure you use 8 nouns (red), eight verbs (green), 8 adjectives (purple), 8 adverbs (aqua), 4 prepositions (brown), 2 conjunctions (blue), 2 articles (pink), and 1 interjection (yellow) in your rough draft. You must also choose a name for your sea creature. Type this rough draft in Microsoft Word using their highlighting capabilities and bring to class for revisions, making sure that the parts of speech have been designated as requested in the directions and that all characteristics of your sea creatures are included in your essay. Once your revisions are made in class, you will make the necessary changes and pass the final copy in the following day for grading, together with your completed copy of your painting of your creature from Microsoft Paint. Make sure to use your Final Copy Checklist to ensure you have completed all aspects of this paper.
